MORSE KEY FOR HOME CONSTRUCTORS

Our friend in the Netherlands, Geert PA3ALG sailed into Weymouth Harbour last year with details of a simple DIY Morse key - paddle type. We are grateful for his permission to print it. Here are the details, though the original wasn't his own work!

A Jack-in-the-Box

Home made Single Paddle after a design of N2UHC

When Jaap PA0IF started a QRS CW round on Friday nights, I thought: 'This is the chance to improve your lost CW skill'. And I must say, it's quite successful. Copying is reasonable, I pull out the essence fine, but sending code with the Lockheed Electra hand key leaves much to be desired.

I had admired Jaap several times before, when he operated his home made electronic keyer with single paddle. What happened there seemed like magic, with a perfect code as result. Wim PE3WIM, Wim squared thus, was able to read Jaap's morse code perfectly with his computer decoding-program.

During my visit to the shack of Wim PA3ALG, he showed me a single paddle key in kit form from KENT Electronics. Beautifully machined brass parts of high quality on a black, powder coated heavy steel base. Wim managed to convince me that working with such a paddle is easily mastered.

I'm not the type for ordering such a kit right away and put Google at work to orientate myself. I hit the site of N2UHC, www.geocities.com/n2uhc/paddle.html describing a CW paddle made from printed circuit board. I still had some PC board leftovers from the school and homebrew projects and started to work on that. Further down a description of how to construct such a wonderful device.

After finishing the piece of work, I plugged it into my FT-817 and told this mini set that the built-in keyer is going to be used. Wim is quite right, learning to send is easy and sending an error sign (if needed) is a piece of cake. Dots and dashes are perfect and one is able to send at higher speeds than with a hand key.

Because I want to take this paddle with me whenever I travel, it makes a fine combination with the FT-817, I searched for a protective housing. During my search I caught sight of a small wooden box with a swing-lid. I once got that from Anton PE1JAS as a birthday present with a home made devil from copper wire in it; a little devil in a box thus (or Jack-in-the-box). I removed the little devil and oh wonder, that box had exactly the right dimensions! On the last 'technical night' I showed it to several members of our club.

Construction

This paddle is made out of double sided non etched printed circuit board, 2 mm thick. The base plate measures 50 x 38 mm; the back plate 38 x 16 mm; the lever 45 x 13 mm and the two contact plates 19 x 13 mm. Once the components have the proper dimensions, they can be polished with some abrasive and protected against corrosion with a spray of blanc lacquer. It's easy to solder through that stuff.

Put some solder on the lever where the screws make contact. The contact points are brass M4 bolts with M4 lock nuts. The knob is made from three pieces of polypropylene, 2 mm thick. An approximately 8 mm hole is drilled in the lever to enable bending. Enlarge this hole in small steps with a file at the top and bottom, until the required flexibility is obtained. Before you start filing, carefully interrupt the copper tracks on both sides with a small hacksaw.

No need to solder the back plate to the ground plate over the entire length, a few spots will do.

A 3 core cable (e.g. from an old PC mouse) is laced through the two holes. One wire is soldered to the back plate, the dot and dash wires to the front part of the lever.

The paddle can be attached to the table with small pieces of double sided tape, and can easily be removed again.
