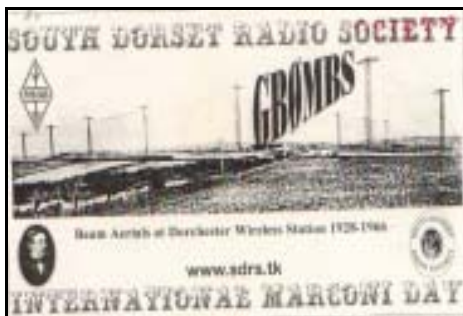

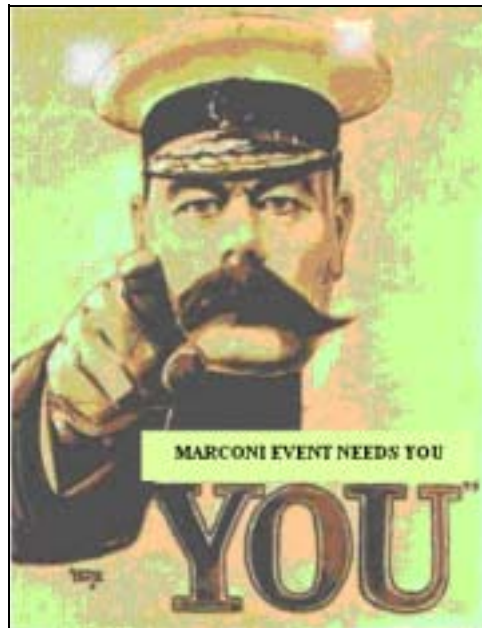
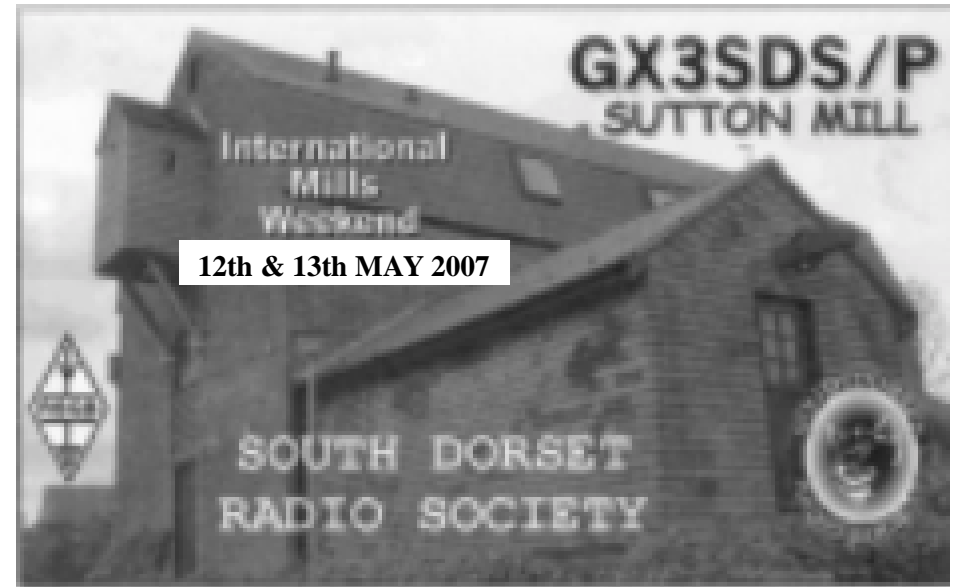

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2006-2007

One year ago the SDRS balance stood at £1,854.64. It is now £1,570.46. This marked decline in our funds results from a much smaller than usual income base. Subscriptions only raised £321 (2006 = £410) while the only other incomes came from raffles and refreshments. There have been no donations or proceeds from sales or any other event. Thus, a rather worryingly low income of £530.30 is reported, while our expenditure has remained much the same, at around £814 giving an excess of expenditure over income of £284.18.

This year the SDRS membership has halved and yet the overheads are still with us.

What do we get from our very ordinary - and reasonable - membership subscriptions? Well, a hefty slice, £168, has to go for insurance premiums. It would be foolhardy for any society to undertake outdoor events especially involving members of the public, without consideration of the risks involved.

In this respect may I mention the efforts of 2E1WON, Jamie, our Health and Safety Officer, who has applied himself punctiliously to this role, seeking out in his risk assessments various issues that may be raised, and have to be answered, should we ever need to submit an insurance claim. I have recently received this year's invoice - no change: £168.

It would be equally foolhardy not to have RSGB Affiliation. The specialist advice and help they can offer is particularly useful, but such a privilege does cost money - £44.

Fortunately there is no longer any need to pay for the annual radio licences. Hiring this hall costs at present £210 a year, which is helped to some extent by income from raffles and refreshments.

I think the membership should appreciate that the Society is kept alive by the few members who attend meetings. It is they who buy refreshments, bring raffle prizes and participate in events. Perhaps a New Club Year's Resolution for members should be 'I will attend Club meetings'.

The Committee strives to organise a first-rate line-up of guests, who deserve better audiences than has been the case recently. Generating more income by raising subscription levels would be non-productive. More members (and their guests) at meetings would go a long way to equalising income and expenditure, and the convivial atmosphere generated by a greater turn-out might even bring an increased membership. 'The more the merrier' is a hackneyed old saw but it is one that rings so true.

The Committee recommends no increase in subscriptions for the coming year at least: subscription levels have been kept unchanged for many years.

I was proposing to step down this year from being Secretary and Editor of the Catswhisker Magazine for South Dorset Radio Society, but I might have known there would not be anyone else willing to take on the position. People are so willing to tell you what to do and how it is to be done, but nobody is willing to take it on and do it themselves. I also believe that they know that I would not let SDRS go into retirement until other people get off their hands and decide that they do have a club worth fighting for and putting some effort into it themselves to make it even better.

The club survives at the moment on the Special Events that are organised by the few. I am afraid to say that Robert G0RYL, Graham 2E1GOQ, Jamie 2E0WON, Carol 2E1RBH, Bob Palmer M3DPQ and members from Yeovil Club are still willing to carry this on, but would like to see more people joining in. Robert and myself are "going to get a life" as the saying in to-days world goes. We will help with the Marconi celebration as this is close to each of our hearts, but as for the other events, it will have to be someone else making the preparations and organising the details. This means that another Member of the Club has to become an Event Manager and do some of the donkey work with other like minded people. If not, then the event will not go ahead, and SDRS will soon lose all the credibility it now has, this of course could mean the ultimate death of the club. I do not believe this is what any one really wants to see. I do, not for, one, and of course there are many others who feel the same. We will soldier on for another year, and hope that by this time next year someone will come forward to take the responsibilities on for the future. (Or maybe I am just dreaming).

ARTHUR WERRETT M0VAW was also awarded the **DX TROPHY** as no other log books were put forward. This was also awarded for the Gibraltar contact.

BOB PALMER M3DPQ (Bedford) **SPIRIT OF AMATEUR RADIO**

JOHN ROSE M0BQO was awarded the **CONSTRUCTORS TROPHY** for the construction of an BFO Oscillator. There was also an entry by Graham 2E1GOQ, but not put forward for judging.

PRACTICAL WIRELESS AWARD was not presented this year as there are no new junior members. The award will be mothballed for a year.

THE MEMORIAL TROPHY FOR BILL DEAN & PAT COX was awarded to **Bob Woolbridge G7LNI, Rob Micklewright G3MYM and the YEOVIL AMATEUR RADIO CLUB** for all the assistance, and participation in the events of SDRS over the last year.

(Without these people's help, with their Chairman's permission and participation, we would have been sorely pushed to have the great events that we have held).

PLEASE NOTE: Bob Woolbridge G7LNI is a member of SDRS.

This will be presented to Yeovil Club on Thursday 19th April at their Headquarters in Yeovil. This is also their AGM Night.

You will see that there is a list of the 2007/8 Committee in this issue of the magazine and there is really only two variations on this, and that is:

JANET DEAN—2E1NRQ is only a standby Committee Member, required only to make a quorum if needs must. Janet will still be doing the teas and coffees on a club night, but would dearly love a hand setting up and clearing away as she is not in the best of health at the moment and neither is Dolly Dean (her mother). So our thoughts go out to them and wish them a speedy recovery and any help that they may require we will be there to assist in any way.

SUSAN COMBS—2E0THW has very kindly agreed to Proof read the Catswhisker each month, so this should lesson the chance of mistakes being made. Thanks Sue.

Robert G0RYL will proof read this copy, as Susan and Tony are getting over the Chest Infection that a lot of people have picked up this year. It appears to be a very virulent strain and very hard to get rid of. So once again we wish them a speedy recovery, and look forward to having them back in the fold soon.

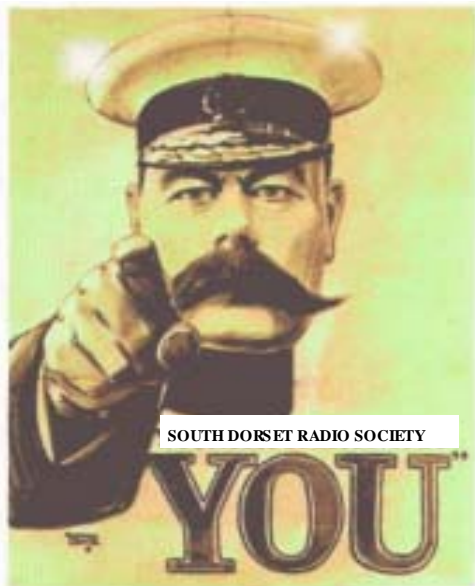
